Step-by-Step Guide to Drinking from the Chalice



Receiving the chalice (the communion cup containing the consecrated wine) can feel a little intimidating, but the process is designed to be a smooth, reverent, and a shared experience – but care is to be taken that nothing is spilled!

1.Stance: Preparation.

Kneel, if you can, to receive Holy Communion – if not, standing is acceptable.

2.Listen and Respond: The Proclamation.

The priest/minister will hold the chalice before you and say, "*The Blood of Christ*" - Look at the chalice and respond clearly: "**Amen**".

3.Guide the Cup: Taking the Sip.

Gently reach out and place your thumb and forefinger on the base of the chalice to help guide it to your lips.

Note: Do not grab or yank the Chalice; simply assist the minister, who will continue to hold and support the weight of the cup. Take a single, small sip.

We DO NOT dip the host into the Chalice – aka intinction

4.Release and leave: The Purificator.

Carefully release your grip so the minister can take full control of the cup. They will then use a small white linen cloth called a *purificator* to wipe the rim of the cup and rotate it slightly before administering to the next person. You may then step away reverently.
